Keller Police Department awarded re-accreditation with excellence


The Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies finished the Keller Police Department's Gold Standard Assessment Accreditation hearing in Colorado Springs this week with a unanimous vote and the special designation of Accreditation with Excellence.

"The recognition of the commission demonstrates not only the commitment of the men and women of the Keller Police Department to providing excellent law enforcement services, but also the commitment of the City of Keller as a whole to position itself as the best place to live, visit and conduct business," Chief Mike Wilson said.

Founded in 1984, CALEA's accreditation program is considered the gold standard in public safety credentialing, focused on strengthening crime

prevention and control capabilities; formalizing management procedures; establishing fair and nondiscriminatory personnel practices; improving service delivery; solidifying interagency cooperation and coordination; and increasing community and staff confidence in their public safety department. Keller PD first earned accreditation from the commission in 2006. This week's re-accreditation was the department's third; recognized departments hold the honor for three years before needing to reapply. The "with Excellence" honor recognizes departments that have completed at least two previous accreditation awards and go above and beyond the commission's standards. It also requires a unanimous "with Excellence" recommendation from the CALEA Review Committee.

"The Keller Police Department is composed of well-motivated professionals that are thoroughly trained and well disciplined," Commissioner David Moore said at the end of the hearing, which followed an intensive on-site assessment of the department earlier this year. "The CALEA standards have been woven into the fabric of the agency and have become an essential component."
