Keller PD is asking area residents to stay alert after a woman running along one of Westlake's trails was briefly grabbed from behind on Tuesday. The contact was made around 6:40 p.m. in the 1500 block of Solana Blvd. along the trail that parallels the road. While the suspect immediately fled the scene, leaving the victim uninjured, we want the community to be on the lookout for any suspicious activity along the region's trail system and report any similar encounters to the appropriate police department.

The suspect in this case was described as a black man approximately 5'8" with a small build and very short hair (if not fully shaved) wearing a plain white T-shirt and dark grey running pants.
